Distinctive Features of the Programme

- The programme is open to Faculty members who have undergone 5 or more FDPs of SMF. It aims to enhance the delivery capacity of faculty by strengthening their course material development/ preparation and class delivery capacities, especially using new and online methods.
- The programme will follow a collegiate system of learning, using Reading Seminar format to make most efficient and effective use of our precious time.
- The admission is restricted to only Twelve+ one participants, from Twelve different states of India, who are keen to conduct at least one such programme on their own, using the expertise of fellow participants of the first programme as resource persons. The restrictions are imposed to make the learning meaningful and effective.
- Following Hon'ble PM's call of Atmanirbhar Bharat, the entire programme material is developed by Krishna Kumar, based purely on Indian experiences drawn over his 50 years in Industry and academics. All the classes will be conducted by Krishna Kumar as Facilitator.
- No sponsorship is permitted, no refunds and no certificate of completion of the programme will be given. The charge per session of 1 1/2 hrs is Rs. 100 only. However, at the end of the programme if someone finds that any one or more sessions "did not generate any learning or were not useful", he can seek refunds for those sessions.
- The programme is aimed to achieve the objective mentioned in Section 7(g) of IIM Act 2017 (reduce the cost and make management education more inclusive using IT).
- This is the first FDP, **Resourced exclusively from the pension of a Pensioner Faculty** of an IIM. **No external grants are being used.**
- It aims to spread SM education through course material and faculty development, as resolved by faculty council and approved by BoG of IIML under Perspective Plan 1993 and charter of SMF
- Each Session will start with an **Eeshwar Vandana** and end with recent popular song played by the Facilitator
- The sessions may demonstrate the importance of Gandhian philosophy of "Do It Yourself"
